

Student with Close Contact Exposure

- At School

Definition of Close Contact: Student has been within 6 feet of an individual at school (masked or unmasked) who has been diagnosed positive for COVID-19 for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more, over a 24-hour period.

Student is not vaccinated.

Student was indoors and masked.

(Parent may select one of two choices:)

Student may remain in school if both of the following are met: (1) remain asymptomatic AND (2) test twice per week for 10 days. [Click for more info.*](#)

OR

Student must be quarantined, at home, for 10 days beginning the last exposure to positive student, and can return on 11th day, as long as they have remained asymptomatic.

Student was indoors and unmasked.

(Parent may select one of two choices:)

If student is tested after day 5 of their quarantine and test comes back negative by day 7, student may return on day 8.*

OR

Student must be quarantined, at home, for 10 days beginning the last exposure to the positive student, and can return on 11th day, as long as they have remained asymptomatic.

Student will be placed on short-term Independent Study with their classroom teacher(s).

Student is vaccinated.

Proof of vaccination needs to be turned into the nurse.

Student may return to school as long as they remain asymptomatic.

Continue to monitor for symptoms for 14 days.

If student becomes symptomatic in any of the above scenarios, see Student with Symptoms of COVID-19.

*Student cannot participate in extracurricular, sports, clubs, after school events for 10 days after their close contact exposure.
