Fasten the doors of the storm cellar!

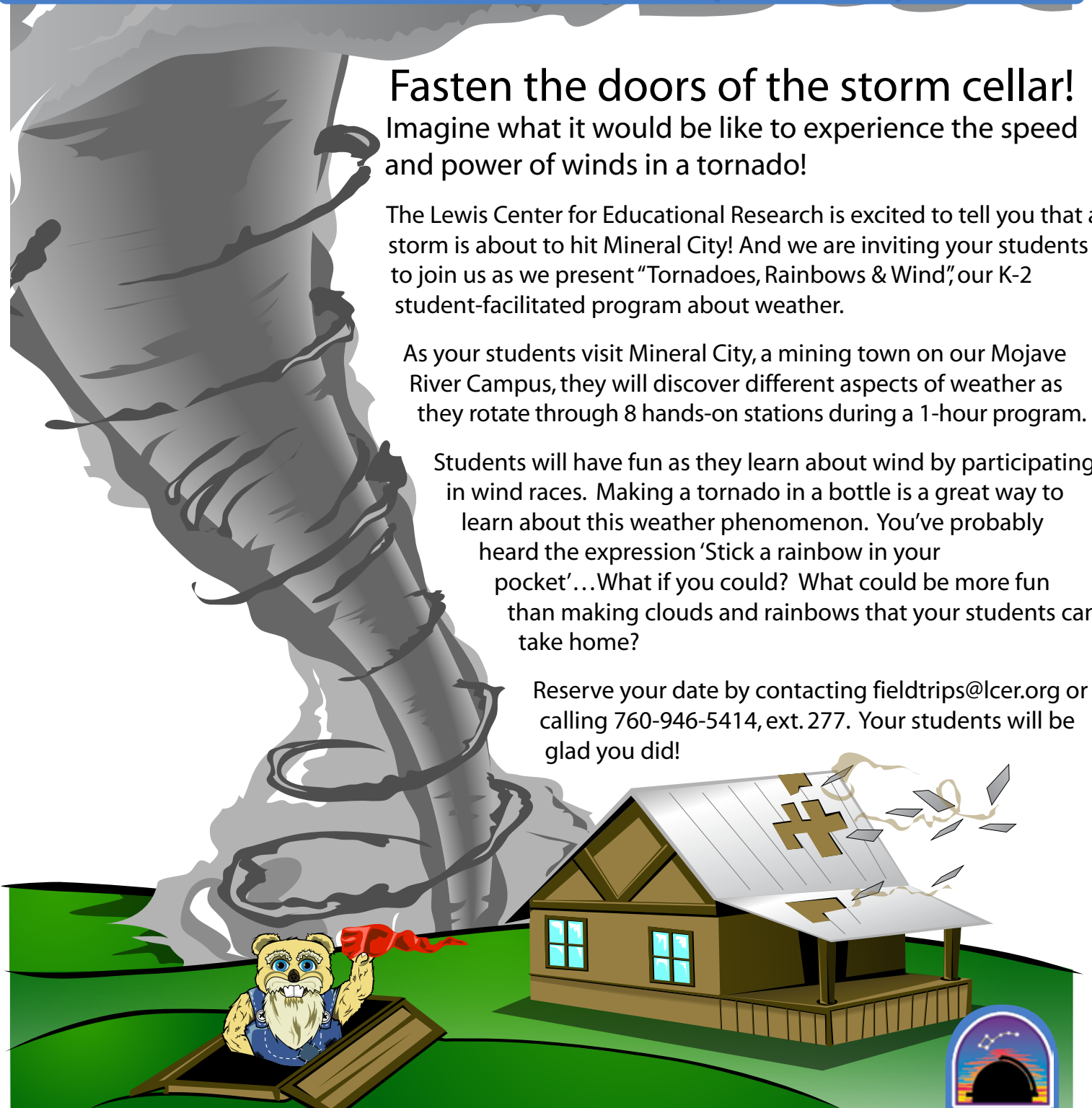
Imagine what it would be like to experience the speed and power of winds in a tornado!
