## **Student Exposed to COVID-19**

Definition of Exposure:Student who spent more than a cumulative total of 15 minutes (within a 24-hour time period) in a shared indoor airspace (e.g. classroom, at home) with someone with COVID-19 during their infectious period. Click on <u>CDPH Guidance on Isolation and Quarantine</u> for more info.

When student is exposed to someone with COVID-19, student should be tested 3 – 5 days after their last exposure (unless they had COVID-19 within the last 90 days) and monitor for symptoms.

If student remains without symptoms, he/she may continue to take part in all aspects of school including sports and extracurricular activities, regardless of vaccination status. It is recommended for students to wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days after last exposure.

If symptoms develop, see "<u>Student with COVID-19 Symptoms chart</u>". If student tests positive, see "<u>Students who Test Positive for COVID-19 Chart"</u>.

For students who are identified as potentially exposed while at school, parents/guardians will be sent a general notification via the student database information system.
